Student Dress Code

Purpose

The Karalee State School community supports a Student Dress Code as it promotes a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment by:

- 1. Promoting a sense of identity for our students and a feeling of pride in the school
- 2. Assisting the ready identification of our students in the school and in representing the community
- 3. Eliminating the distraction of competition in fashion, providing durable and relatively inexpensive clothing
- 4. Developing mutual respect amongst students by minimising visible evidence of economic or social differences.

Expectation

Our students are expected to attend and represent our school in correct uniform. We encourage our students to wear their uniform with pride as they are representing themselves, their school, their family and their community. Our school colours of blue and red, create a composed and distinctive look. We expect all adults in our school community to support and encourage our students to wear the full correct uniform.

Considerations

Our Uniform Committee considers:

- 1. Availability and affordability of items,
- 2. Functionality, durability and practicality of items

Our school is an accredited 'Sun Smart School' with Queensland Cancer Council.

Uniform Shop

The Uniform Shop is operated through the P&C Association to provide affordable, good quality uniforms for the school and contribute to fundraising efforts by the P&C. Please refer to the school website for contact details and opening hours. Uniforms can also be purchased online through Munch Monitors.

Free Dress Days

Free dress days may be organised throughout the year to celebrate a particular event or raise funds for Student Council. These are approved by the Principal and P&C. Participation is not compulsory; however clothing worn on free dress days must meet the following criteria:

- Must be sun safe e.g. covered shoulders and midriffs
- No inappropriate logos, images, slogans or wording e.g. alcohol/tobacco
- Safe footwear shoes must be enclosed; no thongs, high heels etc

Monitoring School Uniform

Karalee State School seeks the support of parents and carers to ensure their child is dressed every day in the correct school uniform with closed in shoes, white or black plain socks and a KSS school hat. Should a family experience financial hardship thus affecting the wearing of the school uniform, the Deputy Principal or Principal should be contacted immediately. All information shared will be kept confidential.

Regular, routine uniform checks are conducted by class teachers and leadership team. Students who do not follow the dress code will be supported through logical consequences:

- Allow loan items to be worn (administration support and parent/carer approval)
- Discreet removal of inappropriate clothing or unsafe jewellery item/s
- Private discussion about the student's non-compliance
- Contact parents/carers when required

Karalee State School Dress Code

All uniform items are available for sale from the P&C Uniform Shop. There are also second-hand alternatives available. Our uniforms are SunSmart as per Cancer Council Queensland guidelines.
